The lodging at the Clem Miller Facility are shared bunkhouses. The lodge and some bunkhouses are wheelchair accessible. There are a limited number of tent sites available. Priority will be given to families with children and the first requests for tent space that we receive. Please assume that you will be in a bunkhouse unless you receive an email confirmation about a tent site. Whether in a bunk or a tent, you will need to bring your own bedding, including: sleeping bag or blankets, air mattress or sleeping pad, pillow, and a towel. There is a central bathroom building with heated showers. While there are no electrical outlets in the restrooms, there is photo-sensitive lighting.

The Confab price includes workshops, lodging at the Clem Miller facility, and meals Friday dinner through Sunday lunch.
